## Amateur Golf's Masters

RUMFORD, RI - From the time I started working at Golfweek in the fall of 1983, I have been interested in amateur and college golf. I covered my first NCAA Championship in 1985 and my first U.S. Amateur in 1987 and haven't missed attending either since.

Way back then, I was also covering a great deal of professional golf as well, the PGA Tour and all its majors, some LPGA Tour and even some Senior Tour events.

But my love was with the amateur game.

In January of 1995, while attending the Golf Coaches Association of America's annual convention, I was talking with my good friend Jim Ahern of Titleist and Foot-Joy. We talked amateur golf and I listened intently. Jim was, and still is, "The Man" when amateur golf is concerned.

He told me simply, "If you're serious about covering amateur golf, you have to go to the Northeast Amateur." That June, I did just that. I contacted Denny Glass, who had recently taken over as tournament chairman from Bill Lunnie, and after about three phone conversations, I was booking my ticket.

Oh sure, I had heard of the Northeast Amateur and knew it was one of the top-tier events on the amateur schedule. I'd also heard a little bit about Wannamoisett Country Club, being a Donald Ross-design and being a par-69, which I really thought was unusual.

Still, I knew I was about to head into uncharted waters as far as my coverage in amateur golf. I even admit, heading to the course the first time - after getting lost once or twice - I was a bit nervous. I knew some of the players, but not one person associated with the tournament.

To this day, I remember walking into the registration area - or what I now term as the "War Room" - and seeing more than a half dozen strangers, among them Glass, Ray Coogan, Ed Conaty, Gene Voll, Lunnie and Jake Conley.

Now here's the most amazing part of it all. I introduced myself and within ten minutes I felt like I had known these gentlemen all my life. They gave me

a warm welcome and even started ribbing me about this or that, which continues to this day. Maybe, most important, are the friendships that have developed and lasted over the years with so many of the club members, tournament officials and rules officials from the Rhode Island Golf Association.

I have not missed a Northeast Amateur since. In fact, the first thing I mark on my travel/coverage schedule each year is the week in June after Father's Day, destination Rumford, R.I., and Wannamoisett Country Club.

Over these past 16 years I have seen some great players don that Northeast Amateur champion's blue blazer, among them Notah Begay III, Brad Elder, Jonathan Byrd, Luke Donald, Anthony Kim and Dustin Johnson.

And what about the list of winners before that? It's a "Who's Who" of golf - Ben Crenshaw, Scott Hoch, John Cook, Hal Sutton, Jay Sigel, Bob Lewis, Allen Doyle and David Duval among them.

That's without mentioning the players who have competed in this event over the years and not won it - names like Tiger Woods, Fred Couples, Jerry Pate, Curtis Strange, Corey Pavin, Jay Haas, Jim Furyk, Ben Curtis, Davis Love III, David Toms, Matt Kuchar, Bryce Molder. The list goes on and on. In fact, anybody who was anybody - and is anybody today - more than likely cruised the fairways at Wannamoisett during a Northeast Amateur.

It's probably why I still continue to hear players, and with good reason, refer to the Northeast Amateur as "The Masters of Amateur Golf." You won't get much of an argument from me on that assessment.

It's also a lot of fun, not only for players, but for club members, volunteers, spectators, etc. I've had the opportunity to play in the Am-Am a couple of times and had the good fortune of being paired with players like Kuchar, Molder, Donald, Aaron Baddeley and Chris Nallen.

## PERSPECTIVE

I've also served as the master of ceremonies for the event's long drive contest on numerous occasions (Denny Glass says I have to earn all those free meals I get during tournament week). Doing this has been a real treat. And there's no better place for a long drive competition than on the first tee at Wannamoisett with the clubhouse patio packed to standing room only with spectators.

Year in and year out, this tournament attracts one of the strongest fields of any amateur event. It is played on a great golf course and it boils over with a rich and proud tradition.

Still, to me, what makes a great tournament - at any level - are the people who put on and run the event and all those who support it one hundred percent.

Beyond any question, this is where the Northeast Amateur stands out. It wears the royal crown of hospitality. Club members love the players and the players love the members.

From my first Northeast Amateur in 1995 to my most recent, I've talked to hundreds of participants. To the man, every one first and foremost talks about how well they are treated and taken care of during the week.

A great field and a great golf course aside, this is the reason they keep coming back and continue to talk about the tournament, even long after they have gone on into the professional ranks.

A while back I wrote a feature story on William McGirt, who was making a name for himself on the PGA Tour the second half of 2011. We got to talking about his amateur career and I think he summed up well the feeling of the majority.

"The biggest thing I miss about amateur golf is Wannamoisett and the Northeast Amateur," he told me. "The people there are fantastic and those running the tournament took care of every little detail.

Wannamoisett is one place I wish I could go back and play every year. Even though you always know the golf course is going to win, it's such a great layout and was always in perfect condition for the Northeast. Yea, that's one place and one tournament I really do miss."

In 1931, Wannamoisett was host to the PGA Championship. It has served as a venue for numerous Rhode Island Amateur Championships and for U.S. Amateur qualifying.

For years the club tried to entice the USGA to award it a Walker Cup (which I personally think would be a fantastic site for this international team competition). It hasn't happened.

We probably won't see a Walker Cup at Wannamoisett, certainly won't see another professional major championship there.

What we will continue to see at this great, old club is the Northeast Amateur. For 50 years now it has been a mainstay in amateur golf - what the game is all about.

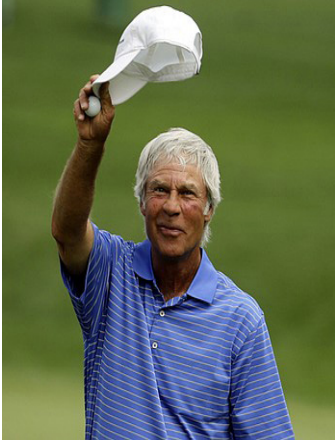

105 acres was simply all the land that Mr. Ross had at his disposal, or needed; thus the par 69 has always been Wannamoisett's "Badge of Honor".

To such rare places in the game I usually say "guard it with your very lives and take care of it."

So my heartfelt congratulations upon reaching the centenary and golfers everywhere wish you a long and happy life.

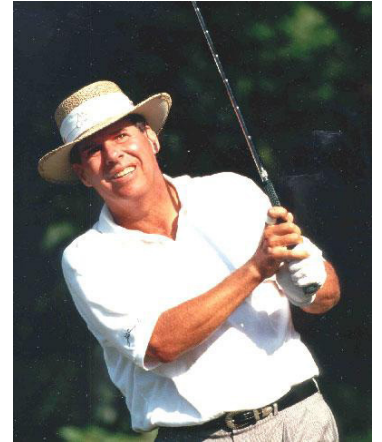

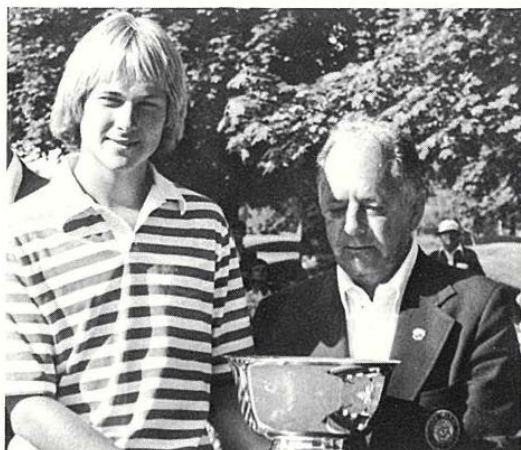

## PAST CHAMPION - JOHN COOK

John Cook's amateur and collegiate career are marked by outstanding achievements, including winning the 1978 US Amateur, 1977 and 1979 Sunnehanna Amateur, two Ohio State Amateur and a California State Amateur to go with his 1979 Ohio State Buckeyes NCAA Championship. His history at Wannamoisett is no less impressive, having claimed back to back victories in the Northeast Amateur in 1978 and 1979.

In 1978, John posted four consecutive 69's for the first time in the tournament history and it was described as "the epitome of consistency" all week, never leading the tournament until the closing holes and edging out Jay Sigel by one shot and Hal Sutton by five.

His title defense in 1979 was an outing for the record books. A third-round 63 set the then course and competitive record, which lasted for 30 years. From there, he coasted to a record nine-shot victory with a record total of 268 (-8), another scoring record that would last 30 years.

*In his own words: "My first year I was just trying to get around the course without making any big mistakes, though I loved the place from the moment I stepped on the first tee. I was proud to shoot four sixty-nines. I had won the Sunnehanna the year before and won some NCAA tournaments, but this was the first win on the national stage. That was a strong field. In '79 I had a crazy (good) week. My game had gotten better and better since winning the '78 Northeast. To return and win there again and shoot that score, well, that was one of the proudest moments of my golf career to that point; it's amazing that the 63 record lasted for 30 years (matched several times over that period, but not bettered until 2011). The 63? I played all the hard holes well, like the second and the fourth, birdied the par-three (15th) up the hill near the finish and birdied the last two. Those wins will always be high points in my amateur career."*

Cook turned professional in 1979 following a finalist finish in the US Amateur. He would go on to win 11 times on the PGA Tour and was a member of the 1993 Ryder Cup Team. He was ranked in the top ten of the Official World Golf Rankings for 45 weeks in 1992 and 1993. He currently plays on the PGA Champions Tour and has 10 victories along with being an analyst for Golf Channel. His son Jason played in the Northeast Amateur in 2005.

As a back-to-back and two-time champion of the Northeast Amateur, John Cook is considered amongst the highest echelon of Northeast Amateur winners and a very special piece of our tournament history. Three of those four times, he walked one of the loneliest walks in golf, the one back to the clubhouse after a playoff loss.

He could have chosen to be discouraged by those events and say it would never happen for him.

But he didn't.

He kept grinding and persevered through one of the toughest experiences of his life. Saturday at Wannamoisett Country Club, he reaped the reward.

Menante, guided by his father Dean and an impeccable short game, claimed the 59th Northeast Amateur Invitational at Wannamoisett (par 69, 6,760 yards).

"This win has been a long time in the making," said Menante, 20, of Carlsbad, Calif. "I have had four second-place finishes this year and lost in a playoff three times. I was happy I didn't have to go into a playoff. This tournament is Top 5 in the world of amateur golf. I am so honored to win."

His four-day total of 9 under was good enough for a two-shot victory over Jerry Ji, a rising junior at the University of Illinois, who finished at 7 under after a final round of 64.

"I knew I had to make birdies to try and catch Dylan," said Ji, 21, of the Netherlands. "I am pleased with giving it everything I had this week. I just came up a few short."

Menante carded a bogey-free final round of 67. He made 10 consecutive pars to start his round.

"I didn't have my best game on the front," said Menante, a rising junior at Pepperdine University. "But my short game helped keep my

round together. I was surprised with how patient I stayed out there."

That patience paid off with two consecutive birdies on Nos. 11 (par 4, 402 yards) and 12 (par 3, 215 yards).

It was a 58-degree wedge from 96 yards to 12 feet on No. 11 and a 5-iron to 15 feet on No. 12.

When Menante stood on the tee on No. 13 (par 4, 374 yards), he had a four-shot lead after Ji gave two shots back. But when he stood on the tee on No. 16 (par 4, 447 yards) his lead was just two after Ji birdied two of his last three.

"After the tee shot on No. 16, I was nervous because I thought I found the creek," said Menante, the 2021 West Coast Conference Player of the Year. "I punched it into the greenside bunker 40 yards short of the green. I hit a great shot to 15 feet. It was nervy considering there is out-of-bounds long."

His short game saved him. He rolled in the 15-footer and was two ahead with two to play.

After an easy par on No. 17 (par 5, 519 yards), Menante's father told him where he stood on the last.

A beautiful drive and approach left him a 40-footer up the hill to the back hole location on its own little shelf.

Nervous, Menante lagged it to two feet. He had two putts from there to win but wanted to keep the bogey-free round alive. He drained it and all the scars from past failures healed.

"I didn't have a name last year," said Menante, who made the PING All-West Region team in 2021. "But winning the National Championship and winning the Northeast Amateur has proven to everyone that I belong here."

Menante is the latest representative of Pepperdine to win the Northeast Amateur. The last player to win from Pepperdine was Fred Wedel in 2016.

His name and jacket photo will be displayed in the Wannamoisett clubhouse forever. He'll be placed among the likes of past champions; Ben Crenshaw, David Duval, Dustin Johnson, Collin Morikawa and renowned amateur R. Jay Sigel.

If those walls could talk.

"It is super important to be part of the legacy of this event and this club," said Menante. "The legacy shows that you have a path to the PGA TOUR and a path to success. It gives me a lot of confidence knowing I belong. I am excited for what the future holds."

## 60th NORTHEAST AMATEUR INVITATIONAL TO SHOWCASE STELLAR FIELD ON RESTORED GROUNDS OF WANNAMOISSETT

RUMFORD, R.I. – For the 60th time, the Northeast Amateur Invitational will commence at Wannamoisett Country Club on June 22-25

But this year, a few things will be different.

This past winter, Wannamoisett Country Club underwent a major restoration of the golf course spearheaded by renowned golf course architect Andrew Green. The changes include new sand and bunker placement to keep up with the modern game, drainage and irrigation, leveling and resurfacing of all tee boxes and adding some length to a few holes. The most dramatic changes are featured on the greens, which include extensive expansions to showcase the unique shapes envisioned by Donald Ross and the addition of new run-off areas.

“The changes that we have made at Wannamoisett were not done specifically for the Northeast Amateur,” said Tournament Chairman Ben Tuthill. “It was done for our members, the future of the club and to make the course more enjoyable for everyone. The changes to the greens will allow us to have new hole locations, which could possibly make the course play a little different. I am excited to see how the course holds up when the best amateurs in the world arrive to Wannamoisett.”

And for the first time, the Northeast Amateur will be part of the newly created Elite Amateur Golf Series.

“The demand from players we invited to the Northeast Amateur was unprecedented,” said Tuthill. “After one email, inviting players to the tournament, we had a full field. That’s not usually the case. I believe the demand is a result of many collegiate players taking advantage of an additional year of eligibility due to the COVID-19 pandemic as well as the creation of the Elite Amateur Series.”

The Elite Amateur Golf Series (EAGS) is made up of seven events: Sunnehanna Amateur, Northeast Amateur, North & South Amateur, Trans-Mississippi Amateur, Southern Amateur, Pacific Coast Amateur and Western Amateur.

Through these seven events, players will compete to earn points through top finishes for the Elite Amateur Cup. The top finishers in the standings at the end of the summer will receive exemptions into various events. Including the Korn Ferry Tour, PGA TOUR and USGA events.

“The discussion about creating the Elite Amateur Golf Series came about during the pandemic,” said Tuthill. “Representatives from these seven events got on a call to share ideas. Over the course of the last few years, it has led to creating a thrilling series not just for the Northeast Amateur but for the other events as well. It is exciting for the players also.”

Tuthill said the field scheduled to come to Wannamoisett is the deepest field the tournament has ever had.

The field features defending champion Dylan Menante of Pepperdine University. As well as a total of 11 players who earned PING All-America honors. The University of Florida’s Fred Biondi as well as Vanderbilt University’s Gordon Sargent and Cole Sherwood made the First Team.

Wake Forest University’s Michael Brennan, Auburn University’s J.M. Butler, Vanderbilt’s Reid Davenport and the University of Texas’ Travis Vick made the Second Team.

The University of Notre Dame’s Palmer Jackson, Baylor University’s Johnny Keefer, Ohio State University’s Maxwell Moldovan and Oklahoma State University’s Brian Stark made the third team.

The NCAA Champion Texas Longhorns will be represented by Vick and Mason Nome. Sargent was the NCAA Individual Champion, making him the first NCAA Champion since Southern Methodist’s Bryson DeChambeau in 2015 to compete in the Northeast Amateur. Ryan Burnett of the University of North Carolina was a runner-up for the Individual title after Sargent won in a playoff.

Other notables include AJ Ewart, of Barry University, who was selected as the Division II Jack Nicklaus Award winner. His season included seven victories and a stretch of four consecutive wins and with him securing a win in five of his last six regular season events. Last year’s U.S. Amateur runner-up Austin Greaser (North Carolina) and reigning U.S. Mid-Amateur champion Stewart Hagestad, both will be competing in the U.S. Open at The Country Club in Brookline, Mass. Other U.S. Open participants include Charles Reiter (University of San Diego),

Biondi, Moldovan and Vick.

Coming back for the second time is former U.S. Junior Amateur and Sunnehanna Amateur champion Preston Summerhays, who helped his Arizona State team to a runner-up finish in the National Championship. The field includes many of the top juniors in the country, including the Western Junior and back-to-back Terra Cotta Invitational Champion Caleb Surratt, who will be competing for the first time.

There's a strong contingent of New England and Rhode Island talent in this year's event. Including Wannamoisett's Davis Chatfield and Bobby Leopold. Chatfield finished in a tie for fifth in 2021 and Leopold is the reigning Rhode Island Amateur champion. Other players with local ties include the University of Oklahoma's Patrick Welch, who is a four-time Rhode Island Junior Amateur champion, and reigning Connecticut Amateur champion and University of Virginia standout Chris Fosdick.

Two-time past champion (1978-79) John Cook will be returning to Wannamoisett. Those victories helped set him up for a successful career at Ohio State and a professional career that included 11 PGA TOUR wins, a Ryder Cup victory (1993) and 10 PGA TOUR Champions triumphs. He will be a part of the Sponsor/Contestant Tournament on Tuesday, June 21 and will speak to the competitors at the dinner following the event.

"It is important to us to always highlight a part of our history," said Tuthill. "With this being the 60th playing of the Northeast Amateur, we wanted to celebrate someone that is a big piece of our storied event. Having John come back is special for our club, our members, our sponsors and our players. The game has changed so much since John won his back-to-back titles, however his tournament record stood for nearly 30 years. I'm sure winning the Northeast Amateur back then was just as important to John as it is to our champions today as far as confidence and proving they can compete against the best amateurs in the world."

This year's Northeast Amateur field will feature players from a total of 10 countries and 49 different colleges and universities. Including a total of 40 players who received Division I PING All-Region honors.

"I am impressed with the depth of the field and talent we have coming this year" said Tuthill. "I believe it is a result of us building on the previous 59 editions along with the EAGS. For me as a golfer, a fan of the game and a Wannamoisett member, it is one of my favorite weeks of the year and I don't even pick up a club. I get to interact with our players and meet a lot of new people. It is truly a special week at the club."
